




O1 Charlotte Brontë biography & summary

Brontë was born April 21, 1816. She was a british novelist, poet & Governess. She died March 31, 1855 with her unborn child due to her illness caused by pregnancy. She released Jane Eyre (originally published as Jane Eyre : An Autobiography) in 1847, under the name of a male to be able to publish. Brontë lost her mother age five due to cancer, she had a very difficult childhood while Jane Eyre lost her parents very young, & had a very difficult childhood as well.
